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Introduction

This Guidebook is a reference tool intended for service providers who serve newcomer clients. It outlines programs and services available in the community that help to meet the settlement needs of recent immigrants, refugees, and refugee claimants to Hamilton.

Since the settlement process is unique to each individual and family, this Guidebook contains an inventory of a broad range of services that are categorized accordingly:

- a) Immigration
- b) Settlement Services
- c) Housing
- d) Health
- e) Education
- f) Employment
- g) Recreational

Many organizations address multiple needs of newcomers and may be listed in more than one category. Identifying what is considered to be a settlement services is not always clear.

This Guidebook includes settlementspecific organizations as well as a broader range of local agencies and institutions, which serve all members of the community including newcomers.

Every effort has been made to include upto-date and accurate information about city-wide programs, services, and municipal agencies.

To provide effective services for newcomer clients, service providers should be familiar with various immigration classes used by newcomers to immigrate to Canada. By understanding the differences between various immigrant classes, service providers will be able to identify the services and programs for which their clients are eligible or ineligible.

The following section outlines the federal, provincial and municipal programs for which various immigrant groups are **not** eligible. The chart below describes eligibility to services based on immigrant group.
